## \$2.5m Scotts Point erosion boost

Moreton Bay Regional Council will put a stop to foreshore erosion at Scotts Point with \$2.5 million to be spent constructing a seawall and replenishing sand along Margate Beach.

Division 6 Councillor Rae Frawley said the project would help protect more than 150 metres of coastline adjacent to Whytecliffe Parade, between King and Albert streets.

Cr Frawley said construction was expected to begin in April 2012, with the tender awarded at a recent council meeting.

"In recent years Scotts Point has suffered significant erosion damage from storm surges and high tides," Cr Frawley said.

"Council has been keen to find a permanent fix for the area and that's exactly what this project will deliver.

"The new seawall will help to stabilise the foreshore and protect the popular Margate Beach and Scotts Point Progress parks well into the future," Cr Frawley said.

"More than 4,000 cubic metres of new sand will be used to replenish eroded dunes and restore the beach to its beautiful best.

"This will also have an added benefit, helping to create a safe and rejuvenated foreshore with even better access to Margate Beach."

Cr Frawley said the Scotts Point works were the latest addition to a list of projects that are helping to preserve Redcliffe's famous and much-loved foreshore areas.

# Local Heroes Honoured

A dedicated community hero who has donated the past 10 years helping her local community while juggling four kids and her own business has been crowned Moreton Bay Regional Council's Citizen of the Year while a 13-year-old fundraiser and community worker has been honoured as the region's Young Citizen of 2012.

Michelle Hewitt of D'Aguilar and Benjamin Freeman of Eatons Hill were announced as winners of the coveted awards during a gala event at the Redcliffe Cultural Centre on Saturday night.

Mayor Allan Sutherland said both had shown outstanding commitment to their local communities.

"Ms Hewitt has made a difference to hundreds of young people across a number of local community groups," Mayor Sutherland said.

"Over the past decade Michelle has devoted her time to doing good in her community as a school canteen coordinator, little athletics coach, founder of a junior touch football competition and in 2011 was applauded for bringing back the Woodford Show's Queen and Princess Quest after 14 years.

"Her work with young people across various groups coupled with the challenges of running her own business, managing a farm and being a single mother has seen Ms Hewitt's contribution recognised by all members of the Australia Day Awards judging panel who labelled her efforts as nothing short of outstanding."

The Mayor also paid tribute to 13-year-old Benjamin Freeman as the region's Young Citizen of the Year.

"Benjamin continues to be an inspiration and an active young role model to many of his peers in his duties as a school leader at Albany Creek High School," Mayor Sutherland said.

"At just 7 years of age Benjamin began getting involved in community and volunteer work with his fundraising activities already delivering \$20,000 to the Mater Mothers' Neonatal Intensive Care Unit.

"Benjamin, still just 13, has also been personally acknowledged by Major General Mick Slater for his leadership abilities and service during the Queensland Floods.

"Legacy Day, the Remembrance Day Poppy Appeal, Queensland Cancer Council, World Vision, the Salvation Army Red Shield Appeal, Young Care, MS Read-a-thon, Uncle Toby's Big Splash Swimathon and Queensland Surf Life Saving have also beneficiaries of Benjamin's energetic fundraising efforts,

receiving close to \$15,000 in the past six years.

"Congratulations to Benjamin on being an exemplary young citizen of this region."

Ken Wood of Redcliffe is Moreton Bay region's Sportsperson of the Year in recognition of his outstanding and continued contribution to develop the region's swim talent.

"As the coach of the Redcliffe High Performance Centre at Redcliffe Pool, Ken Wood has developed a number of swimming legends," the Mayor said.

"So consistent are his methods that he has had swimmers in the Australian swim team for the past 25 years.

"There's no denying he's got the formula right.

"Ken is an inspiration to all sports people and has shaped the lives of many young athletes including the likes of Leisel Jones, Geoff Heugel, Kylie Palmer and Jessicah Schipper, just to name a few.

"In recent times Ken has also dedicated his time to training international swim teams who inject thousands of dollars into our local economy every year."

The Moreton Bay Region's Young Sportsperson of the Year Award was won by Scarborough's Ethan Chan, who recently competed and picked up gold, silver and bronze in 400m, 200m and 100m freestyle events at the 2011 Special Olympics in Athens.

"Ethan also competed in the Global Games in Italy last year where he picked up bronze and silver in the 100m and 200m freestyle relays," Mayor Sutherland said.

"Ethan's was selected by the judges for his dedication to his sport, not only striving to achieve personal excellence but for also representing Australia and the Moreton Bay Region.

"This is a young man with a bright future ahead of him and with Ken Wood as his coach maybe even a champion in the making."

The Koala Action Pine Rivers group received the Environmental Achievement Award for its dedication and commitment to preserving native wildlife corridors and the iconic Australian species.

"The groups work has been instrumental in helping to educate and create awareness of koalas in our region and how to care for them," the Mayor said.

"Not only do all the funds and grants received go towards improving bushland habitats, but the group also provides support to those raising and nurturing koala orphans."

Meanwhile Wamuran Sports Club

Children's Carnival took out the Community Event award, attracting more than 2,000 people and raising thousands of dollars for the local Wamuran sporting clubs.

"The fact a committee of less than 10 people organised such a successful carnival is unbelievable and just goes to show the true strength and community spirit of this region," the Mayor said.

"I congratulate all those involved in creating such a successful event."

Madeleine Johns of Scarborough is the winner of Moreton Bay Region's Cultural Award for her outstanding contribution and involvement in the field of performing arts.

"From performer to committee member, director, producer and now owner of her own Performing Arts Academy, Madeline has certainly achieved and given a lot back to the community since she first joined the Mousetrap Theatre Group in 2007," Mayor Sutherland said.

Madeline has also raised thousands of dollars via productions for a number of beneficiaries including the Redcliffe Hospital and The Premier's Flood Relief Fund.

"This year's winners have all made an outstanding contribution to our community," Mayor Sutherland said.

"They've been nominated by the community for their work in the community and that has to be the greatest accolade.

"Congratulations to the winners and nominees for helping to make a difference in the Moreton Bay Region because tonight we've had the opportunity to honour and thank the real unsung heroes of our community."

### Live bushfire information site now available

Queenslanders are now able to access live and up to date information on bushfires in their local area through a new map feature on the Queensland Rural Fire Service website. The "Current Bushfire Incidents" page would allow public access to the latest Queensland Fire and Rescue Service information on bushfire incidents across the state. Getting information out to the public is as important as the operational response to a bushfire. This map provides local residents with another way to access information on fires in their area. With a few clicks of the mouse, residents can find out a fire's location, when it was first reported as well as its current status. You will also be able to read any advice or warnings released by the Queensland Fire and Rescue Service relating to a particular fire of interest. The information on the site is fed directly from systems used by the QFRS in response to fire incidents. The information on each fire is updated automatically every 30 minutes so that locals can stay informed on fires impacting their communities. This live fire page on the rural fire website, along with information broadcast through the media, the QFRS social media pages and local communication methods will provide the public with as much information as possible on what to do during bushfires. It's a great resource for the local community to help them stay safe during the bushfire season.

Mayor Allan Sutherland said the University of Queensland Environmental Management student had completed a work experience role with Moreton Bay Regional Council last Friday (January 20, 2012).

"Jackie jumped at the chance to come on board and learn more about council's environmental conservation activities," Mayor Sutherland said

"She has a passion for native fauna and flora and council has given her the chance to get her hands dirty alongside our team of environmental scientists.

"She's been involved in a range of local environmental projects, from water sampling to helping to identify areas for future Koala fodder plantings.

"It's been a great experience for Jackie and I hope she'll continue to be a strong advocate for our Moreton Bay Region environment."

Jackie said work experience with Moreton Bay Regional Council had given her the chance to score on-the-job experience before university resumed in February.

"Having grown up in the Moreton Bay Region, it's been a great opportunity to learn more about what

is being done to protect and preserve our local environment," she said.

"One of my goals is to encourage balance among humans, our environment and wildlife - and I think councils play a big role in helping to educate local communities.

"It's something I'm passionate about and it's been great to be part of the local effort."

Sustainability Spokesperson, Cr Rae Frawley said Jackie's enthusiasm for the environment had been recognised with the 2011 Don Perrin Environmental Bursary.

"Not only does Jackie have a strong academic record, she has demonstrated an impressive passion for being involved in the community," Cr Frawley said.

"The bursary is one way Moreton Bay Regional Council is helping to nurture the region's young environmentally focused scientists of the future.

"But it's even more pleasing to see Jackie return to help council's environmental efforts in the Moreton Bay Region."

Cr Frawley said applications for Moreton Bay Regional Council's 2012 Don Perrin Bursary will open on Monday January 24, 2012.

"The award is designed to help with the educational expenses of a student undertaking tertiary study in a field like science, marine science, environmental management, environmental health and environmental education," Cr Frawley said.

"The \$2,000 bursary can be used to pay for things like course fees, textbooks, materials, or college accommodation."

To be eligible, students must be residents of the Moreton Bay Regional Council area, have graduated from year 12 within the past two years and have accepted an offer to study an environmental-based university degree commencing the year the bursary is offered.

## Finding out what your property is worth? by Mel Vaisey

The requests for online appraisals has increased over the past two week which could indicate that home owners are looking to put their homes on the market or that they are just curious as to the value!

Agents have access to Automated Valuation Reports (Called an AVM) which give a range that the property falls into as well as an approximate expected price. This is estimated from recent sales and does not take into consideration the individual aspects of a property such as number of bathrooms, whether there is deck or second living area or whether the property has been renovated. To get a more accurate appraisal a personal inspection is required.

When we do an initial onsite appraisal it is based on the AVM, recent sales and listings in the area and local knowledge. Once the onsite inspection is complete we can provide a much more accurate estimate of the expected sale price.

Our estimate will not always be the highest as that isn't what it is all about – overinflating a price is called “buying a listing” which is of no benefit to the seller or the agent. So, as a potential seller, beware and don't just take the highest appraisal value, be realistic about your

expectations.

Look at the information and ask questions of your agent. Remember most buyers these days are well educated and have done their “homework”. They will instantly know if your property is overpriced and although you can drop your price, the first 2 to 4 weeks are the most important, so a realistic price in the beginning is essential.

Also a good marketing campaign is important and it doesn't have to break the bank!

Over the past 12 months prices have declined and in some instances have even surprised the agents with the drop.

The “experts” give conflicting views but it is still the buyer who decides the final price. A property is only worth what someone is willing to pay for it.

As a seller you have to weigh up what you want to do – stay where you are or sell and move on to a new Life Style.
